ORDER

The University vide notification 1st above, had invited applications from colleges for Continuation of Provisional Affiliation for the academic year 2021-22. Accordingly the Principal and Controlling Officer, Govt. Homoeopathic Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram had submitted application for the same and remitted necessary fee.

The University conducted inspection at the college and the report of the inspection commission was placed before the scrutiny committee. The Scrutiny committee in its meeting held on 15.04.2021 and 10.09.2021 after verification of the inspection report and the compliance report subsequently presented by the college has recommended to grant Continuation of Provisional Affiliation to Govt. Homoeopathic Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram for conducting the Homoeopathy UG and PG courses for the academic year 2021-22.

The National Commission for Homoeopathy, Medical Assessment and Rating Board of Homoeopathy, New Delhi vide 3rd paper above has granted permission to Govt. Homoeopathic medical College, Thiruvananthapuram for continuing admission to BHMBS with 63 seats (including 13 EWS seats) and 30 seats in PG subjects, namely Organon of Medicine and Materia Medica with 8 seats each, Repertory and Practice of Medicine with 8 seats each. (Including 6 seats in EWS Quota) for the academic session 2021-22.

In the circumstances, considering that the list of colleges eligible for admission to UG and PG courses in Homoeopathy during the year 2021-22 had to be forwarded to the Government of Kerala Entrance Examination Thiruvananthapuram for allotment process, sanction is hereby accorded to grant Continuation of Provisional Affiliation to Govt. Homoeopathic Medical College, Thiruvananthapuram for conducting the following Homoeopathic UG and PG courses with the intake mentioned against each for the academic year 2021-22, subject to the ratification of Governing Council.

1. The college shall comply the conditions prescribed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy, National Commission for Homoeopathy, in the permission order granting permission to the college to conduct UG /PG course during 2021-22 vide letter read (3) above.

2. selection, admission and collection of fee shall be made only on the basis of rules and regulation of the University/ Govt. of Kerala and on the basis of direction issued by the University from time to time.

3. In light of the direction of the Supreme Court of India in Writ petition (C) 656/1998 the institution shall take appropriate measures for the prevention of ragging in any forms, in case of failure to prevent the instances of ragging, appropriate action including withdrawal of affiliation of the college will be initiated.

4. Affiliation granted is strictly provisional and only for the academic year 2021-22. The college has to apply for continuation of Provisional affiliation for the ensuing years remitting the fee fixed by the University, along with a copy of letter of Approval from the apex bodies concerned.

5. The college should remitted annual administration fee fixed for UG/PG courses for the academic year 2021-22

6. Admission to the next academic year shall be made only after obtaining prior permission from the University.

Homoeopathic Medical College, Iranimuttom, Manakkadu, Trivandrum, Kerala is hereby granted for admission of for admission of 63 seats including 13 EWS seats for BHMS course and for 30 seats in 4 PG subjects namely organon of Medicine & Materia Medica with 8 seats each, Repertory and Practice of Medicine with 7 subjects each (including 6 seats under EWS quota) for the academic session 2021-22 – regarding

Sir,

As Central Government by notification, constituted a Commission, to be known as the National Commission for Homoeopathy, to exercise the powers conferred upon, and to perform the functions assigned to it, under NCH Act 2020. As per section 59 (2) of NCH Act, 2020, following has been stated:

"Notwithstanding the repeal of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act 1973, the educational and medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder: Provided that anything done or any action taken as regards the educational and medical standards and requirements under the enactment under repeal and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall be deemed to have been done or taken under the corresponding provision of this Act and shall continue in force accordingly unless and until superseded by anything or by any action taken under this Act".

As per provision in the Act, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy has been constituted with the mandate to grant permission to the existing and new medical institution of Homoeopathy. Accordingly, it is to inform you that all the relevant documents submitted by your college in Part-I proforma were examined by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board.

2. On careful consideration of the report, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board has arrived at the following conclusion :-

That the applicant has set up a Homoeopathic Medical College with the component of staff, infrastructure, equipment and instruments and other facilities where as the College has to take certain time bound steps to implement Minimum Standard Requirements of the Homoeopathy College and attached Hospital as prescribed by the National Commission for Homoeopathy for conducting BHMS course in Homoeopathy and deficiencies are:

1. The total deficiency of 09 Hospital staff has been noted against of requirement of 62, which is as under:

- Surgeon (General Surgery) and obstetrician / Gynecologist are on call against the requirement of Full time staff requirement.
- Ward Boys/Ayas 02 available against the requirement of 09.

2. X-ray register, USG, Diet register, IPD & OPD register not provided.

3. The total deficiencies of 17 Hospital equipments has been noted against of requirement of 219, which as under:

- i. Stretcher with trolley 03 instead of 1 in each ward.
- ii. Oxygen cylinder with stand 05 instead of 1 in each ward.
- iii. Diagnostic set (ENT) 08 instead of 1 in each ward.

4. In college laboratories, Department of Anatomy - Soft Part (Dry) and Mummified bodies is not available.

5. The college is having 00 guest faculty against requirement of 08.

6. No Part time teacher of modern medicine available against requirement of 09.

7. The college website <http://www.ghmct.org/> is not functioning.

3. After considering the provisions of section 12C (1) of Homoeopathy Central Council Act, 1973 and HCC(MSR) Regulations, 2013, permission of the Medical Assessment and Rating Board is issued to Govt. Homoeopathic Medical College, Iranimuttom, Manakkadu, Trivandrum, Kerala for continuing admissions for BHMS with 63 seats including 13 EWS seats and 30 seats in 04 PG subjects namely Organon of Medicine & Materia Medica with 8 seats each, Repertory and Practice of Medicine with 7 subjects each (including 6 seats under EWS quota) for the academic session 2021-22. The College Principal is directed to fulfill the deficiencies within three months and an affidavit in this regard may be submitted to the Medical Assessment Board within a period of one week.

4. All admissions in Under Graduate and Post graduate course shall be through NEET/AIAPGET only. It is further informed that, minimum 15% of seats of the permitted intake capacity of BHMS course shall be treated as All India quota. The counseling for seats under All India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling Authority of State / UT Government as designated by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned counseling Authority of that State / UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government for All India quota or the student admitted thereunder.

5. The category wise list of selected candidates may be informed to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy after the process of admission is completed. Any admissions carried out other than NEET/AIAPGET qualified students will not be approved by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board as per rules.

6. The college has to comply with the full requirements of HCC (MSR) Regulations, 2013 for conducting the course. All deficiencies observed and mentioned above which affects the performance of the academic Institution, through which College fails to fulfill the statutory requirements, has to be rectified within three months time from issue of this permission letter. Compliance report shall be submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board accordingly. Subsequently, the Board shall verify the compliance well in time and may conduct Online/Physical inspection for verification of compliance as per the HCC (MSR) Regulation, 2013 and will consider admissions for the academic year 2022-23.
